

Manufacturing Day 2013 State and Regional Totals

Statewide Totals: 23 Counties participated 1,175 Student Surveys Collected Statewide

2.307 Students 110 Teachers

67 Florida Schools 225 Manufacturing Employees 71 Manufacturers and Colleges

Based on individual student responses, student interest in advanced manufacturing careers increased by +32.8 % statewide.

How does Manufacturing Day benefit School Districts

- CTE/ACT/CAPE programs and teachers can build on-going relationships with manufacturers, colleges, and government officials
- Tours and open houses allow teachers to connect the dots for students between classroom instruction and industry uses
- Students can explore careers in manufacturing





SCHOOL DISTRICT INVOLVEMENT IN MFG DAY



What can School Districts offer

- Typically Career and Technical Education personnel are the best contacts for MFG Day coordination
- District personnel can provide information about schools for best matches with industry hosts
- District personnel can arrange and provide bus transportation and substitute teacher compensation
- District personnel can arrange additional press releases for MFG Day events

- Open the doors to your future workforce
- Involve the whole company for maximum impact
- Host tours for students during the day or host open houses for adult workers at night
- Invite government officials and manufacturing associations to attend the tour / open house
- Review the pros and cons of partnering with another manufacturer to host students









- Prepare a short (5-10 minute) overview of what the company manufactures and how the products are used
- Show examples of products that are manufactured
- Organize students in small groups (6-8 students per group) to tour the facility
- As students rotate, each station should show a part of your company's manufacturing process









- Choose tour guides and station leaders that are engaging and loud enough to be heard by students
- Discuss careers, education, and technical skills needed for various jobs in your company
- Provide lunch and special giveaways (t-shirts, flash drives, etc.)
- Distribute and collect surveys before students leave
